A Message from our Chief Executive Officer



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In 2003, a group of concerned citizens, with the support of Flathead City-County Health Department opened a free clinic and began the process of applying for grant assistance. In 2007, Flathead Community Health Center, Inc. secured a grant from the Health Resources Services Administration and was designated a federally qualified health center charged with providing services to the uninsured and underserved in Flathead County.

In 2021, the Health Center separated from Flathead County and became Greater Valley Health Center, an independent, non-profit Health Center. In the three years since then, the Health Center survived the pandemic and has grown exponentially: adding 70 employees, 2 pharmacies, a new clinic in Evergreen and several school-based service sites. We enhanced our already existing services with our dental department offering night guards, crowns and root canals; our behavioral health department adding substance use treatment services; and our medical clinic adding Medication Assisted Treatment for Opioid Abuse as examples.

The most rewarding part of expansion of this scope is the Health Center fulfilling our mission and commitment to meeting the needs of our community and meeting our patients where they need us. We are guided by a volunteer Board of Directors who give us their time monthly to guide our activities. And, of course, none of it would be possible without our mission-driven, very skilled providers and staff. We are so appreciative of the last three years and look forward to what is next. Our goal is to bring integrated primary care to the Flathead Valley using a process that integrates clinical expertise, best practice research and patient values.



2023: Purchased the GVHC Evergreen Clinic



2024: Expanded to 4 days per week in Hungry Horse, added school sites in Evergreen and Kalispell Public Schools

2025: Move into a fully remodeled clinic at 1935 3rd Avenue East bringing us all under one roof

After three years of tremendous growth, we have outgrown our current location in the Earl Bennett Building. Finding a new home was the #1 priority of our recently crafted strategic plan. In August of 2023, we purchased the former Torrent building at 1935 3rd Avenue East and began a remodeling process. We worked with Cushing Terrell to design the space, selected Martel Construction as our contractor and secured financing support from Glacier Bank. Remodeling is underway and we look forward to moving into our new clinic space next summer.

We look forward to establishing in our new location with all of our services in one place. The completely remodeled building will have one floor devoted to medical services. Behavioral health, dental and administration will occupy the 2nd floor with plenty of additional space to allow for groups, community education and program development. The new space will be the headquarters for Greater Valley and will afford us the opportunity to continue to expand, offer fully integrated services to our community and support our other sites across Flathead Valley.

- Expanding services to Kalispell Middle School and Flathead High School
- Hosted 7 students during the school year in our dental, behavioral health and medical programs to provide real life exposure to healthcare careers.
- Awarded our 3rd annual scholarship at Linderman Education Centerto a student pursuing a career in healthcare.
- Provided education opportunities to our staff to build their capability to provide trauma-informed care.

- Launching organizational MANDT training for de-escalation techniques
- Invested in eye movement desensitization and reprocessing (EMDR) training for therapy management
- Developing substance use treatment program with plans to expand to adolescents

- Launched an internal pharmacy technician training program

- Secured grant to support patients with blood pressure monitors at home
- Providing pharmacist led patient consultations for hypertension, diabetes and medication affordability
- Implementing a new platform for point of service in our pharmacies

FAMILY MEDICINE RESIDENCY OF WESTERN MONTANA



10 FTE: Residents, Physicians, Support Staff

- Family Medicine Residency of Western Montana Sponsored by University of Montana, a partner of University of Washington residents in Missoula and Kalispell
- Added 2 faculty members in the Kalispell office.
- We have three 2nd year and three 3rd year patients each year. They see patients at all of our sites.
- Our obstetrical program is offered and supported by our residents and faculty.
- The residency is helping us to develop a geriatric program focused with visits to patient's homes and the nursing home.

- Implemented nursing led medical annual wellness visits
- Intentional focus on patients that have recent emergency room visits and hospitalizations to ensure a smooth transition to home
- Launching Diabetes Prevention Program designed by the CDC to provide support to our diabetic and pre-diabetic patients
- Hosted multiple vaccine clinics throughout the community including Food Bank, Warming Center and several businesses
